
July 2021. The session had an overwhelming response with 153 participants.

Adv. Siddhi commenced the session by highlighting the meaning of Gender sensitivity and related terminology. She discussed the need for mutual respect. She then explained the meaning of the term 'Sexual harassment' and described the manner that it occurs. The participants were briefed about the Prevention of Sexual Harassment act and the Vishaka judgement. She also informed them of the Internal Complaints Committee and the responsibility that they are entrusted with. The session was an interactive session with the students asking questions and making observations related to the topic.

State Level Lecture held on Domestic Violence

The English Department of Dnyanprassarak Mandal's College and Research Centre organised a state-level lecture as part of the Mantra Lecture Series on 30th October, 2021 from 3.00-5.00 p.m. for students from all over Goa. The lecture was conducted in an online mode and streamed live on YouTube due to the pandemic restrictions.

Ms Gayatri Singh, a lawyer from the Bombay High Court conducted the session on the topic, *Domestic Violence: Identification and Prevention*. The cases of domestic violence are very high in India, most of them going unreported because people are unaware of laws that protect their rights. The topic for the lecture was chosen so that students at a very young age are made aware of the laws put into place to prevent domestic violence. Many people also aren't aware that they are being abused, to prevent that, the lecture also covered how to identify domestic violence.

The session began with the Head of the Department of English, Dr M. Shanthi, welcoming Ms Gayatri Singh and introducing her to the participants. Ms Singh then took over the session and addressed the students. She listed out different laws and explained them to the students. She also told them the different signs to look for in case someone they know is experiencing abuse at home.

After her lecture Ms Singh opened the session up to questions. The students asked a number of questions that she gave detailed responses to each of them. The session ended with Asst Prof. Joanita Lobo giving the vote of thanks.

The Mantra Lecture Series is a series of lectures organised by the Department of English to provide a platform where students are exposed to practicing professionals from different fields. This lecture, like the other lectures that preceded it, was a huge success and received positive feedback from the participants.

It is, therefore, crucial to make students aware of the concept of gender and develop awareness-raising methods that generate a favourable space for debate, promote political interest and encourage mobilisation.

Two-day International Conference at DMC

The Department of English, Dnyanprassarak Mandal's College and Research Centre, Assagao, Goa organized a Two-day International Conference on 'Contemporary Discourses: Gender, Ecology and Literature of Protest' on 20th and 21st May, 2022 in the college premises. The conference brought together research scholars and academicians from across the globe who deliberated on issues relevant to the theme of the conference. The students from across the country were also part of these deliberations, who expressed their views through brilliant research papers.

The two-day conference began with an inaugural function presided over by the Chairman of Dnyanprassarak Mandal Shri Shrikrishna Pokle and Prof. K.S. Bhat, Dean, Faculty of Languages and Literature was the Chief Guest for the function. The Vice-Principal of the College. Mrs. Rashmi Redkar welcomed the audience, Mr. Subhash Kamalkar, Assistant Professor, Department of English introduced the conference and Dr. M. Shanthi, Head of the Department of English and Convenor of the conference proposed the vote of thanks. The programme was compered by Ms. Joanita Lobo, Assistant Professor, Department of English.

The inaugural function was followed by the Keynote address via Google Meet by Prof. Feroza Jussawalla, Professor Emerita, University of New Mexico, U.S.A. In her Keynote speech, she addressed related to gender and ecology through various literary examples, with emphasis on Pallavi Rastogi's *Postcolonial Disaster*. She said that there was the need to be cognizant of issues being deliberated at the conference as instances requiring redressals. She also encapsulated India's rich heritage and history of protest literature in English beginning from Nehru, Rajagopalchari and Ambedkar. The writing of Ather Zia also formed the basis of her discussion.

At the plenary session, Prof. K.S. Bhat, spoke on the topic, 'How the Other Half Perceives? Gendering Cultural Studies'. Through his interesting discourse, he highlighted the convergence between feminism and cultural studies. He also discussed a text entitled, 'Reading the Romance', a classical example of feminist cultural studies based on Janice Radway's research.

For the second plenary session, Dr. Harshad Pore, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Mumbai University spoke on 'Gendered Machines, Post Genderism and the Post Human society'.

The first day of the conference had five technical sessions wherein 31 papers were presented on various topics ranging from ecocriticism, ecofeminism and cli-fi.

At the plenary session of the second day of the conference, Dr. Chandrakant Langare, Associate Professor, Department of English, Shivaji University, Kolhapur spoke on the topic, 'Voices from the Periphery: Changing Dynamics of Dalit Consciousness'. In his talk, Dr. Langare highlighted the worldview towards the Dalits and the self-image of the Dalit intellectuals by citing examples from Dalit Literature from Maharashtra.

The second speaker for the plenary session was Dr. Tanmoy Kundu, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Midnapore College, West Bengal via Google Meet spoke on the topic, 'The Dynamics of Representation: The Real and the Reel'. Through five significant movies he brought to light the various facets of patriarchy and gender bias prevalent in Indian society.

Prof. Elisabetta Marino, University of Rome, 'Tor Vergata' Italy, was the speaker for the next plenary session. She spoke on the topic, 'Anti-Anthropocentric Perspectives' and explained



how the works of many British and American writers with the theme of nature, contain antianthropocentric ideas.

The second day of the conference witnessed 14 paper presenters voicing their views with confidence and poise.

The valedictory function was graced by the Vice-Principal, Mrs. Rashmi Redkar and Dr. Chandrakant Langare was the Chief Guest. Dr. Langare commended the Department of English for taking the initiative of organizing a conference on a very significant topic. However, he advised that, it should not be confined to mere deliberations but the many questions which were raised need to be resolved by making provisions to address those issues. The participants gave positive feedback and opined that it was a well-organized conference with apt resource persons, great hospitality and good food. The function ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Dr. M. Shanthi.
