

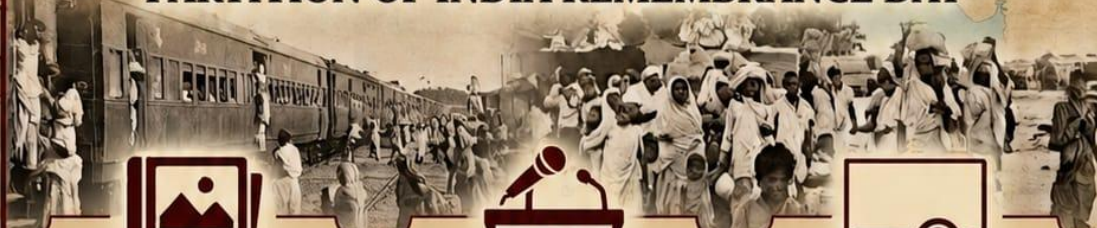

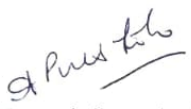

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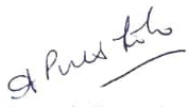

Report on Quiz Competition on the Freedom Struggle

The **Department of History organised a Quiz Competition on the theme “The Freedom Struggle” on 12 August 2026 at BF5.** The competition was organised with the objective of encouraging students to deepen their knowledge of India’s freedom struggle and to create greater interest in the people, events and movements associated with the country’s journey towards independence.

The competition received an **enthusiastic response from students across different streams of the college.** A total of **50 students participated, forming 25 teams of two students each.** The participation of students from the Arts, Science and Commerce streams gave the event an inter-disciplinary character and contributed to a lively and competitive atmosphere.

The quiz covered different aspects of the **Indian freedom struggle**, allowing students to test their knowledge of the personalities, events, movements and developments connected with the national movement. The questions encouraged students to recall what they had learnt while also engaging with the broader history of India’s struggle against colonial rule.

The participants displayed considerable enthusiasm throughout the competition. The close competition among the teams reflected the students’ interest in the subject and made the event engaging for both participants and those present. 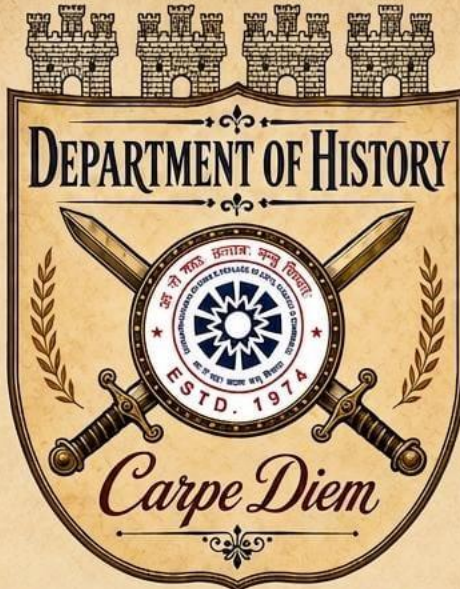

Report on Exhibition on “Significance of Vande Mataram @ 150”

The Department of History organised an exhibition on the theme **“Significance of Vande Mataram @ 150” in collaboration with the Department of Archives, Government of Goa.** The exhibition was organised to commemorate 150 years of *Vande Mataram* and to familiarise students with its historical background and its association with India’s national movement.

The exhibition presented a range of exhibits connected with *Vande Mataram*, the freedom struggle and the growth of Indian nationalism. **An important part of the exhibition was devoted to the evolution of the Tiranga, tracing the development of the Indian national flag through its different stages. The exhibits enabled students to understand how the flag evolved alongside the national movement and eventually came to represent independent India.**

The exhibits also provided students with an opportunity to engage with aspects of India’s struggle for freedom through visual and historical material. **By bringing together the history of *Vande Mataram* and the evolution of the Tiranga, the exhibition placed two important national symbols within the wider historical context of the freedom movement.**

The exhibition received an enthusiastic response from the college community. **Altogether, 118 students and 16 teachers visited the exhibition, bringing the total number of visitors to 134.** Students from different streams visited the exhibition and interacted with the material displayed.
